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Highwood Public Library & Community Center Furthers Partnership with NorthShore University HealthSystem to Ensure Health Equity in Highwood and for Spanish Speaking Communities in Lake County

More than \$600,000 from NorthShore's Community Investment Fund will build on the library's effort to continue bilingual preventative health and mental health education, case management and family counseling

HIGHWOOD, IL – January 30, 2023 – This month, the Highwood Library and Community Center announced receipt of \$628,000 from NorthShore's 2023 Community Investment Fund (CIF) to build on the library's Health Equity program. This amount is in addition to \$578,000 received in 2022 to expand access to health equity programs and services in Highwood and throughout Lake County.

"We are thankful to be able to partner with NorthShore University HealthSystem to provide critical services to a historically-underserved community. As a result of the programs funded by NorthShore, individuals and families in this community are reporting that they have increased knowledge of mental health concepts, access to resources, and the tools to better prevent and manage diseases. This transformational impact would not have been possible without this support," said Carmen Patlan, Executive Director of the Highwood Public Library and Community Center.

The library's Health Equity program has had a significant impact on the Highwood community thanks to its highly qualified, bilingual staff of licensed professional counselors, case managers, and community engagement specialists. Over four thousand individuals of the community have been serviced by the program to date, including a coordinated emergency response the Highland Park July 4th parade shooting. In the three weeks following the tragedy, the library provided over 500 sessions of counseling and case management to more than 300 people.

The additional CIF investment in the library's Health Equity program will support the completion of a community needs assessment to help community members overcome the barriers related to the social determinants of health including insufficient income, lack of transportation, lack of childcare, and education opportunities. Functional health literacy programs, mental health education, case management, counseling, and support groups will also continue to be available for marginalized community members and families of color throughout Lake County.

"These powerful partnerships are all about creating meaningful, lasting impact through data, relationships and resources," said Gabrielle Cummings, President, NorthShore Acute Care Operations and Highland Park Hospital, NorthShore – Edward-Elmhurst Health. "In just our first year, we already made impressive strides and have increased our understanding of how we can work together to make our communities healthier."

NorthShore's Community Investment Fund began last year as part of the merger between NorthShore University HealthSystem (including Swedish Hospital and Northwest Community Healthcare) and Edward-
